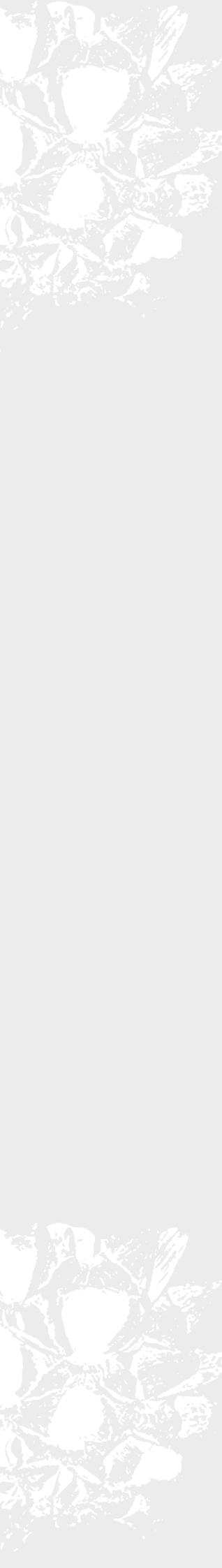
Assessment in VET

- Students must complete all the elements in the individual competencies to be awarded a Certificate.
- Students who cannot demonstrate competency when first assessed will have the opportunity to improve their skills before being assessed again.
- Students who successfully complete individual competencies will be awarded a Statement of Attainment for each competency.
- All assessment is competency based.
- Students may apply for Recognition of Prior Learning.
- Credit indicated is the maximum available for completion of all units in a course.

Adventure Tourism Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation (Multiple Activities)

Course Outline

This program is for students who wish to have a career in the Adventure Tourism industry or undertake further study in this area. Students will participate in overnight camps, kayaking, abseiling, bushwalking and fishing and learn how to administer first aid.

This course covers the introductory skills required for working with engines or metals. It allows insight into what it is like to work in the fields of mechanics, refrigeration, mining or metal fabrication.

Certificate II in Hospitality (Operations)

Course Outline

This course will develop employment and personal skills required for those who are interested in entering the Hospitality industry. The course includes three weeks of Structured Work Placement (SWP).

Instruction and assessment of competencies will take place in an off-the-job simulated work environment both practically and with written assignments.

Certificate II in Information Technology

Course Outline

The course has a hardware focus and students will learn to repair and maintain computer equipment. The skills covered include connecting internal hardware components, connecting hardware peripherals, applying problem solving techniques to routine malfunctions, maintaining inventories for equipment, software and documentation, and caring for computer hardware and workplace skills.

The eight core units contain those basic ICT skills and knowledge required for effective entry into all Information Technology qualifications from Certificate III upwards.

The course includes approximately two weeks of Structured Work Placement (SWP). Assessment of some competencies will occur on Workplacement.

Assessment

Assessment is competency based and may include observation, practical exercises, tests, discussions and simulated information technology based tasks.

Certificate II in Business (Office Administration)

Course Outline

The course aims to provide students with skills by delivering competencies within an office environment. By participating in our virtual enterprise (Casuarina Insurance Virtual Enterprise) students will develop a range of office administrative skills while actively trading with other virtual enterprises throughout Australia. The skills covered include basic communication, using a range of office technologies, business computing, filing, mail handling, basic finance, customer service, reception and telephone skills. Students need to enrol in both lines on which the course is offered as the competencies are integrated to provide a realistic learning environment.

Work Placement: Students may undertake structured work placement as a Community Studies subject.

Assessment

Assessment is competency based and may include observation, practical exercises, tests, discussions and simulated office based tasks.

Certificate I in Automotive

Course Outline

This certificate covers the introductory skills required for working within the automotive industry. This course will enable students to develop skills in the safe use of automotive tools and equipment, identify and understand motor vehicle components/systems and undertake vehicle servicing and repair.

This course includes approximately two weeks of Structured Work Placement (SWP).
