

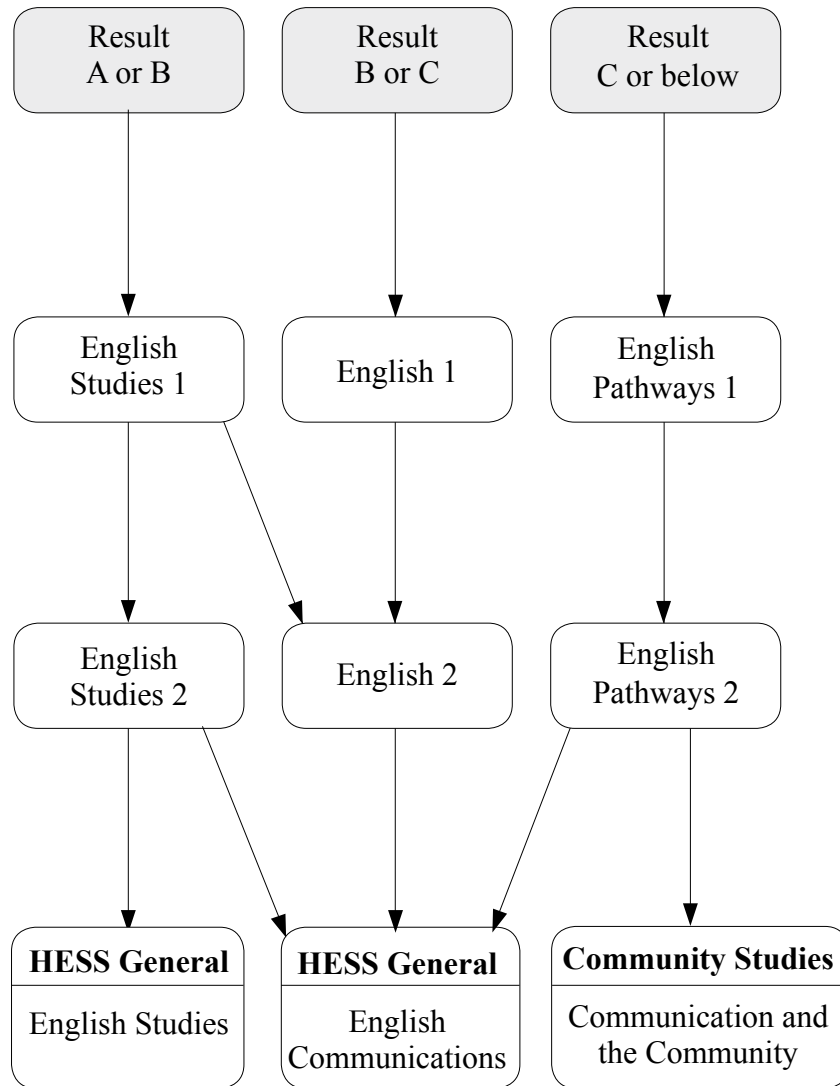

English Subject Description

The Year 10 program builds on the study of the relationship between language and the ideas and feelings which authors seek to convey and to build on understandings and skills which CSC assumes have been undertaken in Year 9 English. The Year 10 program of study will include complex texts and will focus on the relationship between speakers and writers in their social and cultural contexts, the voices and styles of their texts, and their listeners, viewers and readers.

Content

Semester One will include study of prose narrative, poetry, critical reading and an exam where students will be provided with the stimulus material.

In Semester Two students will be selected or recommended to select either Pre English Communications, Pre English Studies or ESL.

The Pre English Communication Course is designed for students who need to develop their reading and writing skills through a range of different types of texts.

The Pre English Studies course is for students who have advanced reading and writing skills. The course has a particular emphasis on the study of literature as well as a range of challenging texts.

In English, students will study a filmic text, respond to a play, study advertising in both print and electronic forms, text production and undertake an exam. In ESL, students will focus on developing research and presentation skills, critical analysis of texts and reading and listening for comprehension.
